MEDITATION of the DAY: Enough for the "Vast Crowd"

a stable and ended it on a scaffold, has penetrated into every place and circumstance of human life, and has gathered every fragment of man's love to be offered in sacrifice.

Think of all the places where Mass is being celebrated at this present moment, the very moment in which you are reading this page; all the cathedrals and all the churches of the world, all the tin huts and mud huts and make-shifts that are the best man can do in many mission fields.... In ships out on the deep seas, on battlefields and camps, in prisons and hospital wards, in the desert and the jungle, in the great cities of the world, in the cottages of faithful peasants in persecuted countries, and under the tall trees of lonely forests of exile.

CRISTO ES EL PAN DEL CIELO QUE ALCANZA PARA TODOS


Jesús se compadece de la gente, por eso decide evitar que se vayan de aquel lugar despoblado sin haber comido algo.

The Immaculate Heart of Mary

Each month, since the Middle Ages, many Catholics have observed special devotions around a particular theme. This month, we celebrate the

Immaculate Heart of Mary.

This Devotion is to recall the emotions of joy and sadness that Mary experienced in her own life. When you look at an image of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, you see a burning heart surrounded with a crown of thorns and pierced with a sword.

The Immaculate Heart of Mary shows us that despite the sufferings of Jesus (crown of thorns), he loves all of us, regardless of our sins, and spilled his blood (the sword) in hope that we would join him in heaven. It is for this reason that despite the trials and sufferings of Jesus, Mary's heart still burns with love and devotion.

As the mother of Jesus, Mary experienced all of the same feelings that your own mother has for you. Whether you are happy or sad, your mother shares in your feelings (even if she doesn't tell you). The Bible tells us that "and his mother kept all these things in her heart" (Lk 2:51). We can share in Mary's emotions and constant love for Jesus by recalling the mysteries of the rosary and by praying the seven sorrows. Excerpted from www.catholicculture.org


FORVIRTUAL MASS:
