MEDITATION of the DAY: Forgiveness of Sins

deliverance and for that of the whole human race. But there is nothing depressing in this cry for deliverance and the deep consciousness of sin which prompts it.... The cry the liturgy puts on our lips is a cry not of despair but of absolute hope—the certain hope that God will come and save us. He is...always in movement towards his sinful creation, running to it with outstretched arms to enfold, to wipe away all tears, banish fear and haunting guilt, affording us utmost security in his forgiving love.

Some may feel that I speak too often of sin, rub it in too much. Others point out that what we need is encouragement, we are too aware already of our own miseries. But are we? Often what we are meaning and what we are confusing with an awareness of sin is self-disgust, self-disillusionment, which nearly every human being suffers from. We have an image in our mind's eye of what we are like, or would want to be like, or think we are really meant to be like, and we fall short of it. We "lose face" in our own eyes, and perhaps in the eyes of others.... What we bewail is largely our human poverty and this our Lord has no intention of taking away. This is what we would like to have removed from us. We are often far more concerned with this than with sin, and while we are occupied with it, battling against it, wringing our hands over it, we cannot be shown where real sin lies. An awareness of our real sinfulness is part of holiness. You simply cannot have holiness without it, for it is the inevitable effect of God's closeness; and this is why true sorrow for sin is never morbid, depressed. It carries with it the certainty of forgiveness....

Come and enlighten us, Sun of holiness. Show us our sloth, our pride, our shirking of the demands of life, our evasions. Reveal to us our sinfulness in the light of your mercy, and then we shall be healed and know perfect joy. —SISTER RUTH BURROWS, O.C.D.

December Devotion The Immaculate Conception

December is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Conception. The Blessed Virgin Mary, in

the first moment of her conception, by a singular privilege of Almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, our Savior and hers, was preserved from all stain of original sin. This age-old belief of the Church was defined by Pope Pius IX in 1854 as an article of revealed truth.

Mary was in need of redemption and she was indeed f redeemed by the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. The manner of Mary's redemption, however, was unique. Instead of being freed from original sin after having contracted it, she was preserved from contracting it. This was a most fitting favor for the Mother of the Redeemer.

PRAYER:

INVOCATION O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.

TO THE VIRGIN IMMACULATE O Virgin Immaculate, Mother of God and my Mother, from thy sublime height turn upon me thine eyes of pity. Filled with confidence in thy goodness and knowing full well thy power, I beseech thee to extend to me, thine assistance in the journey of life, which is so full of dangers for my soul. And in order that I may never be the slave of the devil through sin, but may ever live with my heart humble and pure, I entrust myself wholly to thee. I consecrate my heart to thee for ever, my only desire being to love thy divine Son Jesus. Mary, none of thy devout servants has ever perished; may I too be saved. Amen.

About The Pope's Dec. Intention: For A Life of Prayer

In the Pope's Video for December, this prayer intention is entrusted to all the Catholic Church through the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network (WPN), which includes the Eucharistic Youth Movement (EYM). In a year marked by the global Covid-19 pandemic, the Holy Father shares with us the secret of Jesus' life, "the key for us to be able to enter into dialogue with the Father": prayer.

Through a life of prayer, it is possible to have a personal & profound relationship with Jesus Christ and to change our hearts. Prayer — listening to Jesus, contemplating Jesus, speaking with Him as with a friend—transforms our lives. It's the path to drawing closer to the Father

The Pope's prayer during the pandemic

The Pope himself is a man of prayer, and The Pope Video bears witness to this with images taken from the most emotive moments of 2020: the prayer service for the pandemic in an empty St. Peter's Square; a pilgrimage of the crucifix of San Marcelo in Via del Corso, in the middle of Rome; and moments of recollection before the Byzantine icon of Salus Populi Romani at the Roman Basilica of St. Mary Major.

Jesus Christ: a live marked by prayer

For Pope Francis, prayer cannot be reduced to just a space or moment of interior contemplation. "By praying, we change reality. And we change our hearts," he says in The Pope Video.

Prayer always produces a change. "We can do many things, but without prayer, it does not work," he says. In the General Audience on Nov. 4, he also took advantage of the opportunity to explain Jesus' life of prayer. "During his public life, Jesus constantly availed himself of the power of prayer. The Gospels show this to us when he retired to secluded places to pray. These are sober and discreet observations that allow us only to imagine those prayerful dialogues. They clearly demonstrate, however, that even at times of greater dedication to the poor and the sick, Jesus never neglected his intimate dialogue with the Father."

Prayer as the heart of the Church's mission

Today, the Pope's WPN connects millions of Catholics worldwide from diverse countries, cultures, social and ecclesial contexts, through prayer: not just through The Pope Video, but also through the prayer platform Click to Pray and the Camino del Corazón, a path of prayer for the mission. Prayer is essential for the mission of the Church. Let us pray that our personal relationship with Jesus may always be nourished by the Word of God and by a life of prayer.
