MEDITATION of the DAY: Season of Longing, Season of Prayer

a hunger for a spiritual life that is best reflected in prayer, prayer of every type, the prayer of the Rosary, the prayer of singing, the Psalms & so on. This is what Advent is about: the spirit of prayer... It is the period during which we are reminded of the longing of the entire human race for the potential of salvation after original sin. It is the period during which we are reminded of the longing of the Israelites when they were on pilgrimage in the desert after having escaped from slavery to the Egyptians—wandering, weary, lost, confused, just as we are so often, praying that they would get to the Promised Land, which is the symbol of heaven. Advent is a reminder of those nine months of prayer in which surely Mary engaged, praying to the Father, praying to the Son within her, awaiting his advent, awaiting his birth on Christmas Day. It is appropriate, therefore, that we try during Advent—with all the hustle and bustle, with all of the pseudo-Christmas carols being blasted out on the streets, all of the activities attendant to preparation for Christmas—to enter into a season of recollection, a season of reminder, a season in which we reflect on what today's Gospel reflects on: the second coming of Christ. Glorious as was his coming on Christmas Day, his first advent, the second advent will be of immeasurable glory. It is at that coming when all of us will be judged, each of us personally and individually. That will be the advent we hope will assure us of eternal happiness.

November Devotion The Holy Souls in Purgatory

We are at the end of November, the month when the Catholic Church dedicates the entire month to praying in a special way for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

Be sure to take time to pray during these last two day for The Holy Souls, also called the Faithful Departed; these members of the Church who await the purification of their souls before

joining the saints in heaven for all eternity. **The poor souls** in purgatory cannot pray for themselves or do anything to hasten their entrance into heaven, but we can and ought to pray for them as an act of charity. These Holy Souls have died in the state of grace but are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins, and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must suffer in Purgatory. **The Holy Souls cannot help** themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege that we can shorten their time of separation from God by prayers, good works & especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY THE MISERERE

Psalm 50 is a marvelous act of contrition, confession, and supplication by a repentant sinner. It was composed by David after his sin with Bethsabee. In reparation David promises to lead others back to God by telling them of the ways of divine justice. Instead of offering God an external sacrifice which he knows He will not accept, he offers instead the sacrifice of a contrite and humble heart, a sacrifice that will always be most pleasing in the eyes of God.

Have mercy on me, O God, in Your goodness; in the greatness of Your compassion wipe out my offense. Thoroughly wash me from my guilt and of my sin cleanse me. For I acknowledge my offense, and my sin is before me always: "Against You only have I sinned, and done what is evil in Your sight"-- That You may be justified in Your sentence, vindicated when You condemn. Indeed, in guilt was I born & in sin my mother conceived me; Behold, You are pleased with sincerity of heart, and in my inmost being You teach me wisdom. Cleanse me of sin with hyssop, that I may be purified; wash me and I shall be whiter than snow. Let me hear the sounds of joy and gladness; the bones You have crushed shall rejoice. Turn away Your face from my sins, and blot out all my guilt.

NEWS Artificial Intelligence & Robotics

Earlier this month, Vatican News announced a video about the Pope's November Intention re: artificial intelligence (AI) and robotics. AI has made exponential advances, as evidenced by its many applications in different fields of knowledge. Today, 37% of organizations in the world have implemented AI in some way (which represents a 270% increase in the past four yrs.)

In "The Pope Video" this month, Pope Francis clarifies that this progress in robotics and AI "can make a better world possible if it is joined to the common good." In this sense, he hopes for technological progress that does not increase the inequalities in society. If it does, the Pope says, it will not be "true progress". Such progress does not take into account the dignity of the human person and care for Creation.
